Intro: "Hope has two beautiful daughters. Their names are anger and courage; anger at the way things are, and courage to see that they do not remain the way they are."

—Saint Augustine, was an Early Church Father, born in North Africa, became a Catholic Bishop in a town called Hippo. Hippo is now called Annaba and is located in Algeria. Algeria is a country in Northern Africa.

Anger - the Greek word is ogre

Definition: a strong <u>feeling</u> of being upset or annoyed because of something wrong or bad: the <u>feeling</u> that makes someone want to hurt other people, to shout, etc.: the <u>feeling</u> of being angry.

Courage - one Hebrew word is **amats**

Definition: mental or moral strength to venture, persevere, and withstand danger, fear, or difficulty. Anger and courage are **siblings**. Where ever there is hope. These siblings are nearby.

Analyzing Anger

I. Purposes of Anger

1. There are times when **anger** is necessary.

Ecclesiastes 3:8

- 2. Anger makes you realize something has to change.
 - A. Either something around us needs to change.
 - B. Either we need to change.

Thermometer vs. Thermostat

Anger alerts you to what you are called to and what your ministry is.

II. Perspectives of Anger

1. Being angry is not a sin.

Ephesians 4:26 James 1:19-20

2. Be **slow** to get angry.

Mark 3:1-5

- 3. Jesus was angry at religious leaders.
 - A. The people were more concerned about **tradition** than **transformation**.
 - B. The people had hard hearts.
- 4. Jesus was angry at how the temple was being run.

Matthew 21:12-13

- A. His anger had the proper **motivation**.
- B. His anger had the proper duration.
- C. His anger had the proper **limitations**.
- D. His anger led to the proper <u>liberation</u>.

III. Concentrating on Courage

"Courage is the most important of all the virtues, because without courage you can't practice any other virtue consistently. You can practice any virtue erratically, but nothing consistently without courage." *Maya Angelou*

It takes courage to do right and be right.

THE HOUSE OF HOPE MACON

Very few changes in your life will be made until you have <u>courage</u>.

<u>Strength</u> is our ability to carry certain things. <u>Courage</u> is our ability to endure certain things. Strength is external. Courage is internal.

 Courage helps you complete your work.
