INTRODUCTION:

- Faith is the power of putting self aside that God may work unhindered (F.B. Meyer)
- Faith is the capacity to trust God while not being able to make sense out of everything. (James Kok)
- Faith is not doubting at all. This means never having a thought as to whether a thing can be done or not. It means not hesitating, not wondering, not questioning, not considering, not being concerned at all. (Preacher Outline and Sermon Bible)
- Faith is the expecting the word of God to do what it says and the depending upon that word to do what it says. (A.T. Jones)
- Faith takes us beyond mere theology into a direct, intimate relationship with God as a person, which becomes our guarantee of total provision and total security.
- Faith is a living, bold trust in God's grace, so certain of God's favor that it would risk death a thousand times trusting in it. (*Martin Luther*)
- Faith is an act of the intellect assenting to the divine truth... (*Thomas Aquinas*)
- At the end of the day, faith means letting God be God. (John Blanchard)

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LESSON

- I What level of faith do you have?
 - (1) <u>No</u> Faith: a believer with no faith believes that God has the power to save, but not deliver.
 - (2) **<u>LITTLE</u>** Faith: a belief that God's power can overcome some circumstances but not all.
 - (3) **UNSTABLE** Faith: a belief that waivers and approaches the fears of life with a level uncertainty of the outcome.
 - (4) **<u>GREAT</u>** Faith: a belief that God can do the impossible whenever, however, and wherever He wants.
- II How to increase in faith.
 - It is not the <u>QUANITY</u> of faith that defines your level of faith it is the <u>QUALITY</u> of a maturing faith.

Matthew 17:19-20 (AMP)

¹⁹ Then the disciples came to Jesus and asked privately, Why could we not drive it out? ²⁰ He said to them, Because of the littleness of your faith [that is, your lack of firmly relying trust]. For truly I say to you, if you have faith [that is living] like a grain of mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, Move from here to yonder place, and it will move; and nothing will be impossible to you.

A. Faith is increased as we receive the **<u>CORRECT</u>** information from God. <u>**-HEARING**</u>

Psalms 119:105; Matthew 4:4; Romans 10:17

B. Faith is increase as we remain in constant **<u>COMMUNICATION</u>** with God. <u>**PRAYING**</u>

Mark 11:24; Luke 18:1; Romans 12:12; 1 Cor. 7:5; Ephes. 6:18; Col. 4:2

- God's supernatural power is available to us, but it is conditional. We do not possess supernatural power within ourselves. God's power comes only through prayer and faith in his ability.
- Prayer is the vehicle; faith is the energy. It takes both to reach the desired destination.
- Faith stirs prayer and communion with God. A person who really *believes*, who has real faith in God, is driven to pray and commune with God.

C. Faith is increased as we become more **<u>COMMITTED</u>** to God. <u>-WALKING</u>
