



WALKING IN GOD'S PEACE PT 2

- Having peace in perilous times does not mean that trouble has disappeared; it means God is magnified bigger than your problems.
- In John 16:33, Jesus warns us of trouble only after he assures us of peace. Because He knew it would be impossible to face trouble without peace.
- The lack of peace can have severe consequences. **John 20:21-25**
- Thomas lacked peace and is infamous for emotional challenges.

1. Your **Trouble** versus Your **Peace**

- A. Trouble can destroy peace, but peace will also destroy trouble. The one you **magnify** most is the one that will **win**.
- B. Your **peace** must be as real as your **problem**.
- C. True peace will always **outlast** trouble.

2. Trouble **Builds** Peace

Psalm 29:11

- A. It's in trouble where you **recognize** the need of peace and in trouble where you discover that you have peace. More trouble more peace!!
- B. **Future** peace is dependent upon fighting **present** battles. When you have fought enough battles you **recognize** it's not about how much fight is in you but how much peace is in you.
- C. God does not need to take you **out** of the trouble but give you peace in the trouble. **Psalm 23:4**

3. Peace Is The **Bullet Proof Vest** Against The Shots Of Trouble.

THE HOUSE OF HOPE MACON

A. When there is no peace **present** there will be tremendous **damage**.

B. Trouble may come, but peace will **preserve**:

- Your **mind**
- Your **spirit**
- Your **physical body**

C. Peace has the **power** to stop trouble!!
