I. The Roots of Racism in the Old Testament/Hebrew Bible
Genesis 9:18-27 NRSV; Genesis 10: 6-20 NRSV

Noah had 3 sons. <u>Japheth</u>, <u>Ham</u>, <u>Shem</u>. Japheth's descendants are primarily people of <u>Eastern Europe</u>, <u>Germany</u>, and <u>Asia Minor</u>.

Shem's descendants are primarily people of Western Asia.

Ham's descendants were **Cush**, **Egypt**, **Put**, and **Canaan**.

- Cush was also known as Nubia. Nubia is modern day **Sudan**. Sudan is in **Africa**.
- Egypt is in <u>Africa</u>.
- Put is modern day Libya. Libya is in Africa.
- The Caananites were run out of the Promised Land by the children of Israel.

**Relevant Question**: How Can Blacks still be Christians, when many White people used Christianity and the Bible to keep us enslaved and oppressed?

"Black <u>Christians</u> could agree: they sang more songs and preached more sermons about the cross than any other aspect of Jesus' ministry. To be sure, Jesus' life and teachings are important for the Black church community to understand his meaning, especially seeing him in complete solidarity with the <u>oppressed</u>. The classic expression of this aspect of Jesus' ministry is found in the Gospel of Luke. "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me," Jesus said at the beginning of his ministry in a Nazareth synagogue, as he read from the "scroll of the prophet Isaiah," "because he has anointed me to bring good news to the <u>poor</u>. He has sent me to proclaim release to the <u>captives</u>, and recovery of sight to the <u>blind</u>, to let the <u>oppressed</u> go free."

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Black people sang and preached about Jesus being with the poor—healing and feeding them.
